



## **SOLICITATION DISCLOSURE**

International Partnerships, Inc. (International Partnerships) is recognized by the United States IRS as a 501(c)(3) tax exempt charitable organization and qualifies as a 509(a)(1) publicly supported charity. Our federal tax ID number (EIN) is 56-2037201. All gifts are tax deductible to the full extent allowed by law.

In accordance with IRS regulations for tax-exempt organizations, contributions are solicited with the understanding that International Partnerships has complete control over the use of all donated funds.

Our policy is that all gifts designated for a specific project or purpose be applied to that project or purpose, with up to ten percent used for administrative and fundraising expenses. Occasionally we receive more contributions for a given project than can wisely be applied to that project or purpose. When that happens, we use these funds to meet a similar pressing need in the ministry or the area of ministry where they are needed most. It is our policy to meet the needs that God lays before us, so that Christ is lifted-up and the Gospel is advanced.

International Partnerships does not provide goods or services in consideration for contributions.

International Partnerships is an accredited member of the Evangelical Council for Financial Accountability (ECFA). In accordance with ECFA standards for organizations our size, our annual financial statements are compiled by an independent public accounting firm. Descriptions of our ministry activities, our financial compilation report, and our IRS Form 990 return are available upon request.

International Partnerships, Inc., has a fully volunteer board of directors. We have never compensated any board members or directors and our governing documents prohibit us from doing so. We have no employees. We have never engaged professional fundraisers, fundraising organizations, telemarketers or engaged in direct mail fundraising. We do send out periodic email newsletters to those who are open to receiving them.

Some states require charitable organizations that receive donations to register with an agency responsible for regulating charities. As a faith-based, religious organization, International Partnerships is generally exempt from such solicitation registration.
